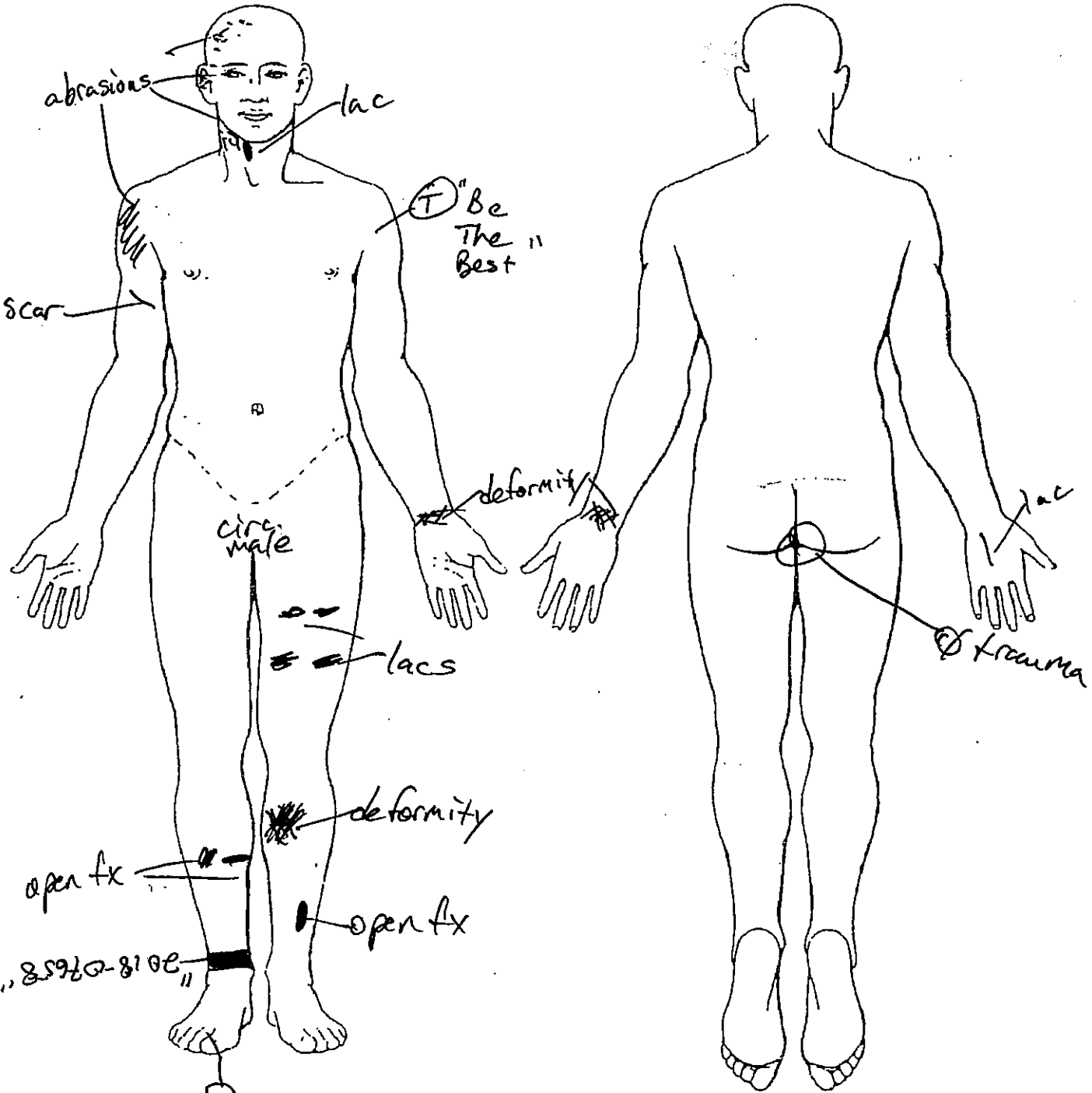





SYNOPSIS
THE DECEDENT WAS INVOLVED IN AN AUTO VS PEDESTRIAN ACCIDENT ON 10/04/2018. 911 WAS CALLED AND HE WAS PRONOUNCED AT THE SCENE. THE DECEDENT REPORTEDLY WAS STANDING IN THE TRAFFIC LANE WITH HIS HANDS UP PRIOR TO THE COLLISION. HE HAD A HISTORY OF MENTAL HEALTH ISSUES. FAMILY FILED A MISSING PERSONS REPORT AFTER HE LEFT THE RESIDENCE ON 10/03/2018 AND HAD NOT BEEN HEARD FROM SINCE. THE INCIDENT WAS NOT A HIT AND RUN AND NO CHARGES ARE PENDING AT THIS TIME.

On scene investigation

Investigation:

On 10/05/2018 at 0000 hours, Dispatcher # A16449 from the California Highway Patrol Newhall Station reported this traffic accident death to our office. It was reported the decedent was walking in traffic lanes when he was struck by a vehicle. 911 was called and death was determined at the scene. The incident was not a hit and run.

I received this field call from Investigator K. McCracken on 10/05/2018 at 0011 hours. Coroner Investigator Trainee L. Darabedian and I left the Forensic Science Center at 0030 hours and arrived on 08/23/2018 at 0100 hours. I cleared the call at 0145 hours.

The decedent was transported to the Forensic Science Center by Forensic Attendant A. Scott on 10/05/2018 at 0150 hours.

His fingerprint return showed a prior drug related arrest on file from 2010.

The case was originally coded an accident however after my review of informant statements I changed the case to an accident versus suicide.

Criminalist call out criteria reviewed and was not met at the time of my investigation.

Location:

Place of Injury and Death: Freeway, Northbound 5 Freeway at San Fernando Mission Boulevard, San Fernando, California 91340

Informant/Witness Statements:

I spoke with Officer Bielman from the California Highway Patrol Newhall Station and he gave me the following information. California Highway Patrol Newhall stations reportedly received radio calls that the decedent was walking into traffic lanes on 10/04/2018. Reportedly he walked from the right shoulder into the northbound #3 lane when a Chevrolet Astro van (license #6TVR390) collided into him. The decedent struck the front portion of the vehicle and the driver pulled over to call 911. Los Angeles Fire Department Rescue Ambulance #89 arrived to the scene and removed the decedent from the vehicle and brought him into supine position checking for any signs of life. Paramedic Ferris #370909 determined death at 2336 hours. The decedent was reportedly standing in the #3 lane with his hands raised in the air prior to impact. The driver of the vehicle remained at the scene and there are no charges pending at the time of completion of this report.

The decedent's sister stated the decedent had a history of mental health issues and was taking prescription medication for them. He had no known prior attempts and it was not known if he had any known ideations. He was known to smoke marijuana and it was not known if he abused any other illicit drugs or alcohol. He reportedly left the residence on 10/03/2018 without telling family of his whereabouts. Family reportedly filed a missing person report with Inglewood Police Department on 10/04/2018 after still not hearing from him. Reportedly he was increasingly complaining in recent weeks of stress and mental health difficulties.

Scene Description:

The scene was a major interstate freeway with 3 designated lanes and a carpool lane. A concrete divider was noted to the center of the freeway. A shoulder and wall were noted to the

east portion of the roadway. Weather conditions were clear and dry. Apparent skid patterns were noted to the #3 lane. A Chevy Astro van was seen in the shoulder adjacent to the #3 lane. Significant front end damage was noted to the vehicle. Blood was seen to the rear passenger side window and sliding door. The decedent was lying on a concrete shoulder. An off ramp roadway was seen to the east of the decedent's location. Blood was noted on the ground near the decedent's head. A search for a wallet, identification card, a cell phone, or any paperwork with the decedent's information yielded negative results. No alcohol, illicit drugs or prescription medication were found. No suicide note was found. California Highway Patrol officers arranged to have the vehicle towed.

Evidence:

No evidence was collected by Coroner personnel in this case.

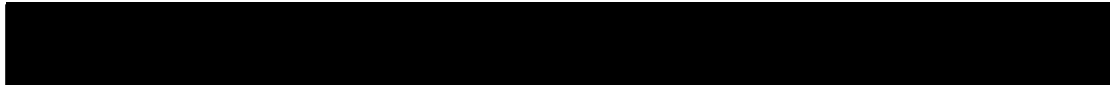
Body Examination:

The decedent was a male Black adult with brown eyes and black hair. He was seen with a beard and mustache and apparent natural teeth. He was wearing a blue sweater, red pants, black socks, and gray shoes. He was seen lying supine with his head to the south and feet to the north. His arms were extended away from his body. Obvious deformities were seen to his legs. There was open lacerations noted to his legs and an open fracture was seen to his right leg. Bruising was seen to his right arm. Abrasion and swelling was noted to his head. Blood was noted to his face and head. Possible fractures were noted to his neck and it appeared abnormally loose. There was no other obvious evidence of trauma seen or palpated. A tattoo was noted to his left shoulder. There were no scars. There were no medical appliances seen. Rigor mortis was not noted. Lividity was not discernible. The ambient temperature was not taken.

Identification:

The decedent was positively identified by his fingerprints from the Department of Justice as Kevin Marcus Ellison, date of birth 01/08/1987.
