## Stepping out to support breast cancer patients

**M**ore than \$562,400 was raised Sunday by thousands of individuals who turned out at Fashion Island to support breast health, according to nonprofit Susan G. Komen for the Cure on Monday.

Breast cancer is the most common cancer in women outside of skin cancers, according to the American Cancer Society. The organization notes that the average risk for a woman to develop breast cancer is 1 in 8 — roughly 13%.

The 31st annual event, the More Than Pink Walk, kicked off early Sunday morning with an opening ceremony and a “pathway of hope” parade that included a brief moment of silence and testimonies from survivors. The walk stepped off at the Pacific Life Insurance Co. on Newport Center Drive.

The event, which returned Sunday for the first time in person in two years, initially had a fundraising goal of about \$550,000. Officials at the nonprofit said the new goal, set to continue through October, is \$600,000.

An estimated 4,000 people came out Sunday, among them about 200 breast cancer survivors and current patients.



About \$913,901 was raised at the last in-person walk in 2019. The virtual “walks” in both 2020 and 2021 raised \$453,739 and \$257,585 respectively.

Funds are put toward supporting those with breast cancer in Orange County and throughout the country.

## Auto shop puts the pedal to the metal to grant local's Make-A-Wish request

Since the Make-A-Wish Foundation granted its first request in 1980, from a 7-year-old boy with leukemia who wanted to be a police officer, more than half a million requests have come into the organization's many local chapters.

With recipients' ages running from 2½ to 18, many wishes center around trips to theme parks, shopping sprees or meetings with celebrities.

But Rancho Santa Margarita resident Moses Suarez — diag-

nosed with leukemia in 2020 at 18 years of age — recently sent out a much simpler request. He asked whether Make-A-Wish Orange County and the Inland Empire might help restore a 2007 Ford Mustang that was near and dear to his heart.

Passed down from his mother, the car needed a paint job, new interior and some serious body work. The hood had opened during travel and buckled the roof, forcing Moses to have to enter the vehicle from the passenger side door or the driver's side window.

Moses' wish landed in the office of Alison Enoka, general manager of Fix Auto Costa Mesa, a body shop and collision repair center on Paularino Avenue. Enoka found herself on the receiving end of a cold call from Make-A-Wish representatives looking to partner with a local business to make the teen's wish come true.

“My understanding was this was a bit of an out-of-box mission for them,” she recalled. “They weren't sure how to make it

## Woman linked to Jan. 6 riot arrested

FBI says Michelle Estey of Newport Beach entered Capitol with other rioters.

A Newport Beach woman will face federal charges after she was arrested in connection with the breach of the U.S. Capitol on Jan. 6, 2021.

Michelle Estey of Newport Beach was arrested Friday in Orange County, along with Melanie Belger of Mission Viejo, according to the U.S. Attorney's Office.

A complaint against Estey and Belger was first filed on Sept. 16. Both are charged with four offenses, including: entering and remaining in a restricted building or grounds, disorderly and disruptive conduct in a restricted building or grounds, disorderly conduct in a Capitol building and parading, demonstrating or picketing in a Capitol building.

An FBI special agent based in Southern California wrote in a re-

## 'Incel' appears in court for first time

Defendant allegedly pepper-sprayed subjects of spurned advances.

A self-described “incel” — involuntary celibate — charged with felony hate crimes after allegedly posting a video of himself sexually harassing and pepper-spraying women in Costa Mesa made his first court appearance Monday, following his arrest five days earlier.

Johnny Deven Young, 25, faces multiple felony assault and weapons-related charges with enhancements for the commission of alleged hate crimes, in addition to two misdemeanor

# Driver who died in solo-vehicle crash, fire in Costa Mesa ID'd

Orange County coroner's officials have confirmed the identity of a driver who was killed early Friday morning in a fiery solo-vehicle crash still being investigated by Costa Mesa police, determining she died from blunt force torso trauma.

The woman — identified as 70-year-old Deborah Jean Holmes — is believed to have been living in her vehicle when the incident occurred at 5:21 a.m. Friday morning, according to sheriff's department spokesman Sgt. Scott Steinle.

"She was in an SUV that hit the median a couple of times before going into a drainage ditch when it hit the wall," he said, indicating the impact caused the

car to become engulfed in flames.

Costa Mesa Fire & Rescue Battalion Chief Chris Coates said Friday crews dispatched to the scene worked to extinguish the blaze before discovering the vehicle's occupant was already deceased. However, it does not appear from the results of an autopsy performed Tuesday the fire was the cause of Holmes' death.

The circumstances surrounding the incident are being reviewed by a special team of investigators who review major accidents and collisions. CMPD spokeswoman Roxi Fyad said Tuesday she could not share any details regarding that work, as the investigation was still underway.

Officials were unable to determine an address or

city of residence for Holmes. Records maintained by the Orange County Superior Court show a Deborah Jean Holmes had incurred multiple misdemeanors and

infractions in the last several years.

One incident of misdemeanor illegal camping in 2015 was ultimately dismissed the following year, just one month after

Holmes pleaded not guilty. A defendant by the same name was also recently arrested on suspicion of battery and disturbing the peace, stemming from a June 20 incident.

The district attorney's office filed misdemeanor charges on Sept. 21, days before Friday's fatal crash.

# No bumpy roads: Cruisin' for a Cure draws thousands

The classic car show aims to prevent prostate cancer.

A procession of classic cars, trucks and vintage vehicles lined up Saturday morning at the Orange County fairgrounds for Cruisin' for a Cure, an event intended to raise funds and awareness around prostate cancer prevention.

Returning from a pan-

democratic interruption, the 21st annual event drew more than 3,000 vehicles to the Costa Mesa site for what's billed as the "largest one-day car show on the West Coast." But more than mere spectacle, Cruisin' for a Cure offers free prostate cancer screenings to men over 40.

Since the first show in 1991, more than 15,000 men have received free blood tests designed to measure levels of prostate-specific antigen, one marker of

prostate health. From those participants, nearly 4,000 men were notified of abnormal PSA levels and advised to consult a physician.

Lake Forest resident and Cruisin' for a Cure founder Debbie Baker led Saturday's 1.5-mile parade around the fairgrounds seated atop a vintage fire engine. The appearance, however, was not her only duty that day.

Baker, whose hot rod-lov-





ing husband Jim died from prostate cancer in 1999, created the event to lower the bar for men who might not keep up with doctor appointments or volunteer for health screenings without a compelling incentive.

Each year, she drives around the event in a golf cart, picking out men of a certain age and encouraging them to get screened for a form of cancer that is highly preventable, if caught early, but which kills an estimated

one in 41 men, according to the American Cancer Society.

For her efforts, Baker has assumed a guardian angel status among men who may not otherwise have caught troublesome health indicators in their early stages. Each year, prostate cancer survivors convey their gratitude by posing with Baker for a group photo.

The show also raises funds for the KSK Cancer Center of Irvine.

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**CAR LOVERS** drive along a 1.5-mile route through the O.C. fairgrounds during Cruisin' for a Cure in Costa Mesa.

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

happen and were reaching out to local collision centers to see if anyone was at least interested in looking at the vehicle."

It turns out, Enoka had a soft spot for the foundation. Her grandson, who had hypoplastic left heart syndrome four years ago, at age 9, was granted a wish to travel to Disneyworld. When she called company leaders to see

what could be done, they were on board.

In a small ceremony Friday outside the Costa Mesa repair shop, Fix Auto members unveiled the result of their restoration and repair efforts, handing the keys back to an appreciative Suarez, now 20.

Inspired by the cause, the team went all out — even equipping the Mustang with a new stereo system. Enoka explained how Juarez had so loved his mother's car as a boy, he begged her not to sell it

but someday pass it down to him. It was a hardship for the single mom, but she made it happen.

"That was the part that really touched my heart," Enoka said Monday. "It took two months and a lot of work. [But] it was divine intervention, across the board."

Gloria Jetter Crockett, president and chief executive of Make-A-Wish Orange County and the Inland Empire, said the partnership between foundation members and area

businesses and organizations is a crucial component of the group's work.

"Our organization relies on community support to continue to bring hope to kids battling critical illnesses across Orange County and the Inland Empire," she said in a statement. "We are so thankful for the willingness and support of Fix Auto Costa Mesa to grant Moses' wish."

port filed with the complaint that the organization was tipped off about Estey and Belger's alleged involvement in the Jan. 6 insurrection. The agent said both women are believed to be shown in a YouTube video titled "D.C. Burning — Jan. 6 DC Riots."

Last December, the agent said he interviewed a longtime family friend of the 53-year-old Estey. The friend identified her in a screencap of the video that shows a woman with blond hair and a Trump beanie in Capitol Building room ST2M.

A cellphone registered to

Estey's husband was also identified as using a cell site that served the interior of the U.S. Capitol building, according to the report.

In order to access the Capitol building room, Estey had to climb through a broken window, the agent wrote. She was inside the room for several minutes with other rioters who were destroying furniture and rummaging through desks and drawers, the agent wrote, before she exited the room before crawling back out through the broken window.

Estey and Belger are both due in federal court on Oct. 4.

counts of violating a person's civil rights. He had been sought by police for months until his arrest in San Mateo County, Orange County district attorney's

officials said in a news release Tuesday.

Authorities believe the defendant assaulted or harassed six people in three separate incidents. On Nov. 21, Young allegedly approached a woman and a man near a bar in the Triangle Square shopping center as they were trying to help another friend who had fallen onto the ground, Costa Mesa police said. The defendant was accused of making lewd comments and asking to see the woman's

genitals, then spraying her and the man, who had attempted to stop Young, with a chemical agent.

Later, authorities became aware of footage allegedly posted to social media by Young in April depicting two other altercations he had with women in the same area. In one, the person filming the video approaches a woman who is in tears while walking through a parking garage. He asks if he can "hook up" with her almost immediately after she tells

him that her car had just been stolen. After she rejects his advances, the person holding the camera makes comments about her genitals and cusses her out.

In the second incident in the video, the man recording it describes his penis to a group of women sitting on a bench. One of them kicks him, tells him to go away and throws an object at him. The man then pepper-sprays her and a woman standing behind her, as well as another who tried

to stop him as he fled.

Young's bail was set at \$500,000 during his first court appearance Monday, and he remained in custody at the Theo Lacy Jail as of Tuesday. He was scheduled to appear for an arraignment hearing Oct. 22.

The public defender assigned to represent him could not immediately be reached for comment.

Young has a prior misdemeanor hate crime conviction in Nevada, O.C. D.A. officials said, and his last

known city of residence was Las Vegas. Police there arrested him and one other man on suspicion of making false threats in an act of terrorism in August 2019. The two of them were accused of shouting "white power" and saying they were going to "shoot up the place" shortly before they were ejected from the XS Club at Encore, according to the Las Vegas Review-Journal.

## N.H. sinks CdM in Battle of the Bay match

The Newport Harbor High boys' water polo team has lacked consistency lately, at least in terms of personnel.

Sickness has plagued the Sailors the last couple of weeks. Coach Ross Sinclair said he was missing three starters headed into Friday night's Battle of the Bay match against Corona del Mar.

"Hopefully we can be healthy on Monday," Sinclair said. "It's been a rough two weeks, to be honest, but it was really fun to see guys step up tonight and fulfill different roles throughout the game."

The Sailors do have depth, and they showcased that in a 14-9 victory over their Back Bay rivals.

Senior left-hander Ben Liechty and junior center Peter Castillo each scored four goals for Newport Harbor (9-1), ranked No. 3 in CIF Southern Section Division 1. Senior Nick Kennedy stepped up for three goals, and senior Finn LeSieur chipped in two goals and three assists.

Newport Harbor scored five unanswered goals in the second quarter to grab a 9-2 halftime lead. They did it largely on the back of Castillo and Liechty, who

combined for five first-half goals, four of those assisted by the other player.

CdM threw a number of defenders at Castillo; four CdM players ended the match with at least two exclusions.

"I just try to fulfill my role," Castillo said. "I do everything I can to hold my position. I like to think that I have legs that can push anybody back, pretty much, and I just use that to my advantage."

Castillo drew five exclusions in the first half alone, and nine for the match.

The Sailors, who finished second to Mater Dei at the South Coast Tournament last weekend, scored five of their eight first-half power play chances. CdM didn't score on its only first-half power play opportunity.

"I think he's a generational talent, to be honest," Sinclair said of Castillo, who also had two assists and a field block. "He's physically there. He's mentally there. He's tough. He goes in and works extremely hard ... and defenders are in trouble every possession."

The match represented the only scheduled meeting of the season, because CdM (8-6) has dropped down to the Wave League. The Sea Kings did not

give up, however, in Friday night's tilt.

They won the second half. Junior center Camren Simoncelli and emerging sophomore Jackson Harlan tied for the team lead with three goals each, and junior left-hander Charles Warmington had three assists and two steals before fouling out in the second half.

Goalkeeper Chase Campbell made five saves for CdM, while junior Luke Zimmerman scored

twice. Senior Nate Evans added a goal.

CdM coach Kareem Captan said he has seen flashes from his Sea Kings, who have a roster of mostly juniors. They hung with Studio City Harvard-Westlake for a while at last weekend's South Coast Tournament, and lost to Huntington Beach by a single goal.

"We all miss the competition," said Captan of being dropped from the Surf League to the Wave

League. "We want better games, but at the same time, we're going to take whatever situation that we get and make it the best for us. Although we're not in that upper league, we have a different focus here the next five weeks leading into playoffs. We have a lot of liberty now. We have a lot of flexibility on what we can accomplish in practice, competition. Our goal is by November to be the best version of ourselves, and I think we're definitely on our way."

Owen Bartlett scored a goal Friday night for Newport Harbor, while Gavin Netherton and Shane Santoni combined for two steals and an assist. Senior goalkeeper Cooper Mathisrud had two saves and a pair of steals.

"It's something we always like to think about," Castillo said of the Sailors' depth. "For Newport Harbor, there [aren't] players, [there are] positions. There's a role that we have to fill for center, there's a role we have to fill for one-two [side] and four-five and center defense. There are expectations for everyone to succeed and complete their role, no matter how old they are or how young."

## Late field-goal block lifts Fountain Valley over Aliso Niguel

The Fountain Valley High football team forged a fourth-quarter comeback, then nearly gave it away in its nonleague finale.

Fernando Garcia made sure the Barons did not, blocking a 33-yard field goal with under a minute remaining to preserve a 16-14 victory over Aliso Niguel on Friday at Huntington Beach High.

After getting the ball back with a slim lead and just over four minutes left, the Barons came out throwing, leading to an untimely interception, as Aliso Niguel's Jack Gill picked off quarterback Noa Banua.

Garcia's block kept the mistake from coming back to haunt his team, as he broke through the middle of the Wolverines' offensive line to make the play.

"Everybody was hyped," Garcia, a senior defensive end, said. "It was a really close game, and to get that block, it was amazing. Everybody was excited. Everybody was pumped. Right before the play even started, they said, 'You better go get this Nando,' and I got it."

Garcia added that senior defensive lineman Matthew Mena helped create a gap for him to block the field-goal attempt, which fell short of the goalposts.

Fountain Valley (4-1) secured a significant win ahead of its daunting Sunset League schedule, which begins with a home game against Corona del Mar (4-1) on Thursday. The Barons positioned themselves to need just one more victory to achieve at least a .500 record. Doing so could loom large if the Barons find themselves seeking an at-large berth into the CIF Southern Section playoffs at the end of the season.

"Tonight's win was pretty big," Nolan Olivares, a sophomore wide receiver, said. "This gives us a lot of confidence going into league. I really think that our first

game, we're going to do really well."

Olivares found himself on the business end of all of Fountain Valley's points in the first half. He brought in a 5-yard touchdown from Banua, and scored a field goal.

Gill's second rushing touchdown gave Aliso Niguel (3-2) the lead at 14-10 in the third quarter. It came after the senior running back showcased his athleticism on a 41-yard carry, during which he weaved through traffic to the Fountain Valley 2-yard line.

"Jack's a stud," Aliso Niguel coach Michael Calahan said. "He doesn't say much at practice, and if you saw him on campus, you wouldn't think he's a football player. He looks like a typical Orange County surfer kid, but come Friday nights, it's a different look for him, and he just goes. He wants the ball, he wants to be all over the field and he's a joy to coach."

The Barons had multiple chances to answer, coming up empty in a goal-to-go situation when Gill tackled Max Smith well behind the line of scrimmage on a fourth-down running play off the right edge.

Undeterred, Fountain Valley retook the lead, as Banua found Luke Taylor on a crossing route out of the slot for an 18-yard touchdown.

"He's just a little workhorse and he shows up in big moments," Fountain Valley coach David Gutierrez said of Taylor. "He's made a ton of big plays. Sometimes, they're overshadowed because we have a high-scoring game, but [they're] huge plays. The catch over the middle; the drag across [to] make it a touchdown."

"He trusts Noa, and Noa trusts him. They really count on each other, so they're doing a great job."

## U.S. women, Japan men excel at ISA World Surfing Games, secures 2024 Olympic berth

Kanoa Igarashi slammed his hand against his surfboard in exultation before throwing it back in the ocean.

The Huntington Beach native delivered another winning performance Saturday afternoon on the south side of the Huntington Beach Pier.

This one, though, had implications for more people than just himself.

Igarashi, the two-time U.S. Open of Surfing winner, won the men's gold medal at the International Surfing Assn. World Surfing Games. Surfing for Team Japan, Igarashi also helped the Team Japan men earn the team trophy, meaning Japan has earned at least spot for the upcoming Olympic Games in Paris in 2024.

"Obviously, the individual win is great, but to know that I secured a spot for Japan in the Olympics coming up, that's such a special feeling," Igarashi said. "The thing is, it's not even whether I go or one of my teammates goes. Just knowing that there will be someone there representing—that means a lot. Honestly, I'd be more than happy to see one of my fellow countrymen go. Hopefully it's not just one of us, hopefully there's multiple of us."

On the women's side, Kirra Pinkerton of San Clemente accomplished the same thing. Her gold-medal individual performance helped the Team USA women finish atop the podium and book at least one Olympic spot for Paris.

Team USA also won the overall team trophy for best men's and women's combined score. Nat Young (fifth place), Kolohe Andino (seventh) and Griffin Colapinto (tied for 19th) were the surfers for the U.S. men.

Gabriela Bryan, who finished tied for ninth, and Zoe McDougall (tied for 21st) were the other U.S. women who helped the team earn victory at the event, hosted by Visit Huntington Beach.

Igarashi, who has dual citizenship in the United States and Japan, was the silver medalist in the Tokyo 2020 Olympics. He was dominant throughout the World Surfing Games, winning every heat in which he competed, to help Japan's men earn the top spot with 1,835 team points along with teammates Shun Murukami and Keanu Kamiyama.

The United States was second with 1,555 points, followed by Indonesia in third with 1,532 points.

Igarashi eased to a win in the 35-minute men's finals, finishing with a two-wave score of 15.96. That was followed by silver medalist Rio Waida of Indonesia (14.04), bronze medalist Jackson Baker of Australia (11.67) and copper medalist Guilherme Fonseca of Portugal (9.36).

"This week I learned a lot about myself," said Igarashi, 24, who earned his first ISA gold medal. "Surfing, usually you have to be so selfish, but I really learned a lot about myself as a person and how important it is to share that competitive edge with the team. A country like Japan, we have so many supporters and so many people rooting for us, we really want to win as a team."

Pinkerton, 20, certainly felt like she accomplished a lot for the Americans. Her final win wasn't decided until the closing minutes, but she managed a first-place two-wave score of 13.63.

Pauline Ado of France, who led for much of the heat, finished in silver with a 13.00 score. Sally Fitzgibbons of Australia followed with a bronze (11.60) and Danielle Rosas of Peru was fourth with a 9.20.

"I'm very happy right now," Pinkerton said after being carried up from the beach. "Hopefully we can have the 2028 Olympics here now, because I want to win it here. I've just been

envisioning this moment for like a week now. Every heat, I've been envisioning winning the heat. In the final, I thought I could get the score at the end. I just can't believe it happened. The last three minutes went flat, and I was just praying that would happen. I'm just so thankful right now, and so thankful to have gotten a spot for the U.S."

Huntington Beach native Brett Simpson, who coached the U.S. in the inaugural Olympics for surfing last year, made sure that Pinkerton knew that she had helped America earn an Olympic spot for 2024 in France.

She described the end of the finals heat as filled with disbelief.

"I just lost my breath," Pinkerton said. "I was like, 'There is no way this is happening.' I actually didn't know if I did win or not because I was too scared to check. I was like, 'Wait, am I just tripping out right now? Did I actually win?'"

Yes, she did, and it likely fueled motivation for her bright future.

"I'm leaving for Portugal tomorrow for another contest that is going to get me closer in the rankings for the Olympics," she said. "I'm just going to be fired up this whole next, like, probably four or five years. I hope I can make it there."

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
