The Vikings captured their second straight CIF Southern Section competitive cheer title on Saturday in Riverside.

The Marina High cheerleading team has had to overcome a fair amount of adversity this year.


It's a young team, with a sizable number of freshmen. And at Saturday's CIF Southern Section Competitive Cheer Championships at King High in Riverside, a fall occurred early in the Vikings' routine.

"It's just a matter of recovering," said Marina junior Kaylen Tran, one of two team captains, who has the position of side base. "We just needed to leave that in the past and do the rest of the routine ... The energy on the floor was good, no matter how we felt about the fall."

The Vikings were rewarded for their perseverance.

Marina won the competition in Division 4A. It is the Vikings' second straight CIF Southern Section title.

Garden Grove councilwoman announces bid against Steel

Kim Bernice Nguyen plans a run for the 45th Congressional District in 2024.

Kim Bernice Nguyen, a member of the Garden Grove City Council, will seek to take Rep. Michelle Steel's seat representing California's 45th Congressional District, she announced Wednesday.

Nguyen, a Democrat, is the first to announce her candidacy for the race in 2024. Following recent redistricting, the district spans parts of Los Angeles and Orange counties and includes Garden Grove, Westminster, Cerritos, Fountain Valley, Buena Park, Fullerton, Placentia and Brea.

Steel, a Republican, recently won her second term over Democratic competitor Jay Chen with 53.6% of the votes in the 2022 midterm elections, according to the Orange

County Registrar of Voters' Office.

Chen has not yet announced if he plans on running for office again next year.

"The response has just been overwhelmingly positive. I am so excited. People are hungry for this. People are excited to see me run. The joke is that I couldn't have been better made in a lab. I'm half Mexican and half Vietnamese," Nguyen said, laughing. "I think this is an excellent opportunity to unify the [Asian American Pacific Islander] and Latino communities to take back this seat and prioritize our voices. I tried to do that in Garden Grove, and I think we've made good progress."

According to the California Target Book, the voting population in the 45th district is 35.6% white, 23% Latino, 2.9% Black and 36.9% Asian.

Nguyen, 31, said while she encompasses a good

Kalmick elected Bolsa Chica Land Trust president

Dan Kalmick, who has served on the Bolsa Chica Land Trust board of directors for more than a decade, has been elected to serve a two-year term as the organization's president.

Kalmick, a member of the Huntington Beach City Council, previously served as the nonprofit's vice president and treasurer. A longtime civic activist, he served eight years on the city's Planning Commission prior to being elected to the City Council.

He replaces Jennifer Thomas, a local real estate agent who served nine

Kalmick said the Bolsa Chica Land Trust, founded in 1992 as an offshoot of the Amigos de Bolsa Chica, is in the process of moving away from acquisition and





portion of the racial demographics that make up the district, she is "hyper-focused" on the issues among them housing, education and healthcare.

spokesman campaign Lance Trover said Steel's voting record revealed "common sense solutions, putting people before politics and being a strong voice against the D.C. status quo is why she receives support from Republicans, Democrats and Independ-

preservation of the Bolsa Chica Wetlands toward restoration and upkeep. "That's really what the

mission is slowly moving toward," he said. "There's really not much left that is not protected. ... There's no property out there that's left for development, so as we move away from that, we need to work on restoration.

"We've effectively completed its first goal, which was preservation of all of Bolsa Chica. Now we're in that time of how do we do maintenance, and finding dollars to maintain and provide tours and docent work and education? We still run a bunch of school kids through Bolsa Chica. We provide funding for busing for a bunch of ele-

and middle mentary schools to bring the kids out to Bolsa Chica [as part of the 'Miracles of the Marsh' program] and take them on tours."

Kalmick said the Land Trust recently used Proposition 1 grant money to fund a study to look at the tidal inlet north of Seapoint Street. The inlet opening gets silted up, so it needs to be dredged.

"There wasn't continued funding from the state for the \$1 million to \$2 million to dredge that opening," he said. "We need to keep that tidal inlet open, because it creates a lot of bird habitat. Once it got open, an enormous number of birds came back to Bolsa Chica and it was a great watershed moment, pun intended."

According to the state Department of Fish and Wildlife, more than 200 avian species have been identified at the Bolsa Chica Ecological Reserve.

Thomas, the outgoing president who remains on the board, said she is proud of the work the Land Trust has done during her time.

"Not too many Realtors are probably into not building homes, saving areas," she said. "If it didn't get saved, I honestly think there would be a harbor out there with a bunch of luxury high-rise apartments or hotels. I don't think that would be a very good thing. Once something's gone, it's


