WHAT TO EXPECT AT CAMP THIS SUMMER

e're now more than a year into the pandemic, and school is in the home stretch. With summer just around the corner, kids and parents can get a reprieve from their pandemic routine. For many, summer camp will be a big part of getting back to normal.

Many local camps will be hosting in-person programs this summer. The YMCA, the Boys & Girls Club of Greater San Diego and SeaWorld are some of the organizations welcoming back kids with updated safety regulations in place. Safety measures include daily temperature checks, enforcing social distancing and frequent hand washing.

"The Y is taking every precaution we can to ensure our day camps are safe, knowing how important these camps are to kids and their parents," said Natalie Corrall, association director of child and youth development for the YMCA of San Diego County.

Campers will be expected to keep their masks on, and many programs have implemented pods to reduce the number of interactions. If a camper is concerned about being with friends, be sure to call the camp a few weeks ahead of time. Once in a pod, it's very likely campers won't be moved easily.

For additional safety measures, parents should send their campers with their own lunch, water bottle and snack. Reminding children how to properly wash their hands (under the fingernails, in between the fingers and getting the thumb) will help make the transition to in-person summer camp easier as well.

Some organizations are continuing to offer virtual programming for those who would prefer to keep their children at home, and some have both in-person and virtual camps. The Sally Ride Science Junior Academy at UC San Diego is hosting virtual STEAM workshops, while the Birch Aquarium at Scripps Institution of Oceanography in La Jolla is offering both virtual and in-person camps for children interested in learning about the ocean and underwater life.

"It is so important to connect kids to nature, now more than ever," said Megan Malaska Medley, the Birch Aquarium's director of education.

Worried parents should remember that camps are dedicated to keeping their campers safe. And while it can be anxiety-inducing not be in control over how often kids wash their hands and how tightly their mask is secured to their face, the camps are required to follow local and state guidelines. Oftentimes, a quick phone call can curb any anxieties.
