Finance	12, 2025, Fannie Mae Financial Crimes Investigations (FCI) received a Document Demand from the Federal Housing Agency Office of Inspector General (FHFA-OIG) concerning the property located at The demand requested the loan file and any related investigative or quality control documentation, as well as all other associated with Adam B. Schiff

The inve	estigation identified occupancy misrepresentation involving two properties:
Key Find	dings:
1.	2009 : The Schiff's refinanced the Maryland property, apparently misrepresenting it as a primary residence, as the borrowers purchased a primary residence in Burbank, CA just four months later.
2.	2009 The Schiff's purchased a condominium in Burbank, CA as a primary residence, however the 691 square foot, 1-bedroom unit appears unsuitable for a family of four, raising doubts about their true occupancy intent.
3.	2010 The Schiff's refinanced the Maryland property during which Adam Schiff declared in a letter of explanation that California is his principal legal residence, and that the Maryland property could be considered a primary residence for insurance underwriting purposes.
4.	2011 A refinance of the Maryland property was executed as a primary residence, just two weeks after refinancing the California property as a primary residence (non-Fannie Mae transaction – occupancy confirmed via the Deed of Trust).
5.	2012 A refinance of the Maryland property was designated as a primary residence despite concurrent primary residence claims for both properties.
