# **NMUSD** signs off on AI security contract

\$5M surveillance system will feature automated cameras that can spot intruders, monitor for signs of emergencies.

A new AI-enhanced surveillance system approved by the Newport-Mesa Unified School District Board of Education at its meeting on Tuesday could be installed and keeping an eye on all of the district's schools as soon as February.

Trustees voted to award the \$5,221,041 contract to Everon LLC, formerly known as ADT Commercial, according to Lance Bidnick, the district's director of maintenance and operations.

The security upgrades feature automated cameras and software that can spot intruders after hours, listen for gunshots or monitor for signs of other emergencies, Bidnick said. Those can then automatically send notifications to police, fire and school authorities that include an image or video clip of what triggered the

her clinical team, Katavic said, a goal that Hoag is seeking to reach by the end of the year.

The program costs \$99 a month and is available to anyone 18 or older. Commercial insurance is accepted for typical primary care things like doctor's visits and lab work, but not for membership fees.

For that cost, Hoag Compass promises testing for more than 100 biomarkers across areas of the body, including heart, inflammation, blood, metabolism, stress regulation and kidney health.

The wellness program also offers nutrigenomic DNA testing, health coaching, mental health support and integrated connection and referrals to Hoag's renowned specialists. Retesting occurs more often, too, every three to six months.

Hoag has stated that it aims to make Orange County a top 10 healthiest county in the nation through Hoag Compass, by focusing on proactive health. The county is currently ranked No. 36 on the list, according to Market-Watch.

Pantig's team at the Newport Beach office includes

nurse practitioner Monica Toten and health coach and nutritionist Ashley Pettengill, who have been on board since December and January, respectively.

"I think a lot of people are used to seeing their doctor once a year, doing their annual exam, hitting those markers," Pantig said. "When you come here, it is more personalized. You get to meet various parts of the team that are very important, your care coordinators, Monica, Ashley, myself. I do pride myself in actually knowing our patients, who they are and their lives, really focusing on the things that are important to them regardless of what their labs are and all of that sort of stuff. I think that's one component of their health, but that's not their whole component."

In-app messaging with the entire care team is offered, as well as virtual or physical office visits.

Hoag Compass patient Hasaam Sheikh, 30, recently had a virtual visit with Pettengill as he was away on business in New York. Sheikh, who lives in Irvine, said he appreciates the personalized approach.

"Éveryone that I speak to at Hoag Compass, whether it be a health coach or a nurse or even the physician for an office visit, they've all

"I think they do a lot of prep work, so if I have a question, all of them have the ability to answer and/or direct those questions to the right folks. For me, it seems like this teambased approach that's helping me live my best life."

ing me live my best life."

Toten said the practice focuses on four main pillars: optimizing your nutrition, your emotional health, your movement or exercise and your sleep.

Visits with Pettengill can

Visits with Pettengill can go beyond simple physical health, she said.

"It could be a mom that's overwhelmed, who feels like she has no help or time for herself," Pettengill said. "That nutrition visit can turn into today, you just [make an] affirmation to take five minutes of alone time, or ask for more delegation of tasks to be on someone else, so that way you can refill your cup. I think they're surprised that we get into that.

"With every person, it's very individual. One person comes in and they have trauma from the past, and that plays a big role in how their relationship is with their food. That's something that you're looking at. How does how you feel about a certain food make you feel, how are you changing your diet to help you sleep? It's not giving everyone the same nutrition advice."

Katavic said Hoag Compass appeals to a younger demographic, like Sheikh, who connects well with the app-based product.

The average patient age is currently 38, he said, though there is a secondary bump in the 60- to 70-year-old age range.

"We know that almost 50% of folks ages 20 to 50 don't have a [primary care provider], or they have one, but they don't utilize them," Katavic said. "They just go to urgent care when they need, and if they have PPO insurance plans, they go straight to specialists. What it means is we're finally making inroads with folks in that age group by giving them a version of care that they actually care about. They're like, 'That speaks to me.'

between the ages of 2.9 and 4. The program had 26 students enrolled on opening day.

"We are so excited to get it off the ground," said Kim Johnson, the district's director of early learning. "This has kind of been a year in the making, and we've created a positive team. We have two amazing preschool teachers with just a lot of energy and excitement to teach this age group."

Johnson said parents and incoming students were invited to a meetand-greet on Monday, providing an opportunity to see the classroom and meet their teachers.

The outdoor space around the preschool building included tradi-tional blacktop activities such as hopscotch, a drawing and painting station, a children's scale with buckets appearing out of each side of an apple tree and four uneven basketball hoops for the kids to sharpen their aim.

As the morning began, the space had collected a bundle of personal toys. The children had taken to balancing and weighing animal action figures inside the aforementioned buckets.

'We're really working on that development of the whole child, so that they're getting those readiness skills as they enter [transitional kindergarten and kindergarten]," Johnson added. "... We're looking at socialemotional, we're looking at behavioral, we're looking at pre-academic skill

Kyle Schneider, a preschool parent, said introducing his kid to others likely to remain within the district was a consideration in signing up for the program.

"I think what was appealing for it is we're in Laguna Beach School District ourselves, and so he's going to be going here through high school,' Schneider said. "He was

in a Montessori school before this, which we liked and enjoyed, but kids were always kind of coming and going.

"We figured putting him here as early as possible to get him a little more stability so that he can get to know the kids that he's going to be with through high school was our biggest selling factor."

Another popular figure on campus was Officer Danny Lopez, the secondyear school resource officer. Lopez was generous with the compliments and the high-fives, and several of the kids slapped his hand enthusiastically as they walked past him.

Lopez, who forms half of the school resource officer team along with Officer Ashley Krotine, spoke to the importance of the program in making connections with youth.

"That's an amazing impact to have, not just from the safety aspect," Lopez said. "That's always a bonus, obviously, but to

really help make them feel comfortable talking to the uniformed person, whether it be a police officer, a firefighter, a para-

"It's great to make that impact because if they ever find themselves in a pickle, or just need direction, or just need someone to talk to, especially as they get older into those teen years, having that rapport builds up with kids, and it gives them an outlet to be able to talk to somebody if they don't feel comfortable talking to their peers, teachers or even their parents, at times."

Laguna Beach High had an enrollment of 822 to begin the school year, disofficials trict said. Thurston Middle School had 534, Top of the World Elementary came in at 540, and El Morro Elementary had 408 as of Thursday.

bulletin.

The system can also monitor the flow of student traffic and bring added security to remote areas of campus, Bidnick said. And it incorporates license plate reader technology that can detect suspicious vehicles.

"Î think a lot of parents can take a deep breath knowing this will be there," school board President Carol Crane said.

Bidnick noted the system is "not foolproof, and that "there's still a human component that's going to be needed for security.' But it will make the process of reviewing footage faster and easier for staff by automatically flagging key moments in one recording, and then identifying potentially related material from other cameras.

Crane asked how the district will be able to safeguard the privacy of families and staff. Bidnick noted the security software NMUSD is purchasing can automatically mask the faces of people in recordings. He also explained it will largely be up to district authorities to ensure that those who need to access the footage are the only ones who can.

Bidnick said the district will need to "keep tight control on our policy and making sure we limit who has the ability to share that footage."

Only district staff at headquarters in their Costa Mesa would have the ability to share footage from the database, Bidnick said. Principals at each school will be able to view recordings but won't have access to distribute them.

The district plans to store footage for up to 30 days. Any clips or images officials might need to hold onto for longer than that can be archived and reviewed indefinitely, Bidnick said.

The installation of the new surveillance system

will not impact instruction, Bidnick said. Over the next 45 days, crews will inspect each campus to identify the best positions for cameras and then set up the equipment after hours and on week-

ends. Meanwhile, servers and other related hardware will be stored and maintained at NMUSD's offices.

Taste of Huntington Beach previously ran from 2001-2019 and benefited the Friends of the Huntington Beach Public Library.


