METHODOLOGY

This Los Angeles Times/Bloomberg News poll is the 540th in a series of opinion studies designed to measure public attitudes on a number of issues. This survey focuses on George W. Bush and his new Iraq strategy. Also included are questions regarding the first session of the Democratic-led 110th Congress.

The sampling frame for this survey is all telephone residences in the nation. One thousand three hundred forty-four men and women 18 years of age or older were contacted by telephone January 13-16, 2007.

The sample for this survey are random selections of telephone numbers from among all working banks of land-line exchanges in the nation, including Alaska and Hawaii. Working banks are 100 contiguous numbers containing one or more residential listings. The use of random samples of telephone exchanges such as these allow researchers to contact both listed and unlisted numbers. Sampled numbers are released in representative replicates to ensure an appropriate regional distribution, and multiple attempts were made to contact each number.

The entire sample of adults was evaluated against the most recent Census Bureau's Current Population Survey demographic estimates of sex, ethnicity, age, education and national region and a weight was calculated to bring the sample proportions into alignment with their respective census proportions, if necessary, for analysis.

For results based on the entire national sample, one can say with 95% confidence that error attributable to sampling for this survey among all adults is at most plus or minus 3 percentage points. For certain subgroups, the error margin may be somewhat higher. Weights such as these are used to account for error introduced when respondents to the survey may differ from those who refused to be interviewed or who were never home during the interviewing period.

While every precaution has been taken to avoid error and increase accuracy, surveys such as this one may be subject to inaccuracies for which precise estimates cannot be calculated and which may, in some cases, contribute to errors of greater or lesser extent than the effects associated with sampling procedures. For example, findings may be influenced by events which take place while the survey is in the field and, of course, events occurring since the time the interviews were conducted could have changed the opinions reported here. In addition, inadvertently biased question wordings and the order in which they are asked may influence results. Such errors and others are the result of the various practical difficulties associated with taking any survey of public opinion.
